Year 4 have made some excellent USA themed projects over half term. We are super impressed with all the work the children have produced! Well done!!






The Year 5 team have been impressed with the home learning from pupils this week. They were asked to find out about the Mary Rose.



Year 6 have begun creating their WW2 themed silhouette pictures in Art.













#### Parent Champion for SEND – Confidential monthly support and advice for families

As a school we want to play a role in improving SEND services for our children. We now have an opportunity to provide a confidential space here in school for families of children with SEND through a new Parent Champion project delivered and funded by SENDiass4BCP and Parent Carers Together.

Each month a dedicated Parent Champion will hold one session to support families in navigating appropriate local and national services and networks to meet the needs of their children. Your child does not have to be on the SEND register at school to be able to access the support. Time slots will be allocated to individual families on a first come first served basis and are held in confidence during the school day.

#### Our next Parent Champion sessions will take place on Tuesday 28th November 2023

To enable us to plan ahead for these sessions we are asking parent/carers to book onto a session by emailing *parent2parent@elm-academy.org.uk*.

If you are experiencing difficulties and are unsure where to access the support and resources you need please do get in touch and confirm your interest in writing.
